Dear Parents and Carers,

It was fabulous to see everyone back at school yesterday, ready for a jam packed 10 weeks of learning and celebration. After my extended leave it was so nice to catch up with the staff, students and families and hear all their exciting news. One thing that did make me a little regretful about the timing of my leave is that I was not here to see my beloved Green faction win the Athletics Carnival, the first time Green will be engraved on a shield that was inaugurated in 2012. Congratulations Green! I would like to take this opportunity to thank Mr Jared Lawson who so ably filled the principal shoes in my absence, aided by the supportive and efficient Mrs Anthea Phoenix, Mrs Christine Ashkenazy and Mr Nathanael Howard. It does indeed take a village to raise a child and when one person is unavailable there are many others that take on the responsibility and ensure student's needs are met.

The staff started the term on Monday with a very full program of professional dialogue around behaviour management and developing individual behaviour plans. Taking the time to work collaboratively our teachers also planned for this very busy reporting term. It is always inspiring to work with dedicated professionals who put students first, always!

Our comparative NAPLAN results are now available. From 2023, NAPLAN results are reported against proficiency standards, with student achievement shown against 4 levels of proficiency. These proficiency standards are reported on reset NAPLAN measurement scales resulting in a new NAPLAN time series beginning from 2023. Results from 2023 on cannot be directly compared to results from 2008 to 2022. This means no NAPLAN to NAPLAN progress or previous proficiency levels will be reported until 2025. Together with the move to an earlier NAPLAN in March, these changes meet an initiative of the 2019 National School Reform Agreement. What this means for our school community is we will not be able to report on progress or trends in quite the same way as we have previously.

This is a very brief overview of the mean scores for our tested students compared to like schools and nationally.

You will see from this our mean scores are, as expected, generally much higher than the national mean, but not meeting our goal of being like, or better than like schools. It is a goal we continue to aspire to.

We continue to look at the data and analyse it at an individual, cohort and whole school level to drive school improvement. If you would like gain a thorough understanding of our data, please come along to the MLPS Board Annual General Meeting on November 2, at 5.30pm in the staff room.

It is a little poignant as I start this term as it will be my last one at MLPS. After repeated urging from my retired husband, aging parents and children I have made the difficult decision to retire at the end of 2023. I have loved my time at MLPS and no doubt I will take the opportunity, as the term progresses and we have our many celebrations, to reminisce about my 21 years here as deputy and acting principal. We are speaking with Education Department representatives to ensure a smooth leadership transition occurs at the end of the year. You can be reassured that we will always work, following due process, to ensure the best outcome possible for the MLPS community. As news becomes available about the principal position for 2024 it will be communicated to you.

As always, my door is open. We value your feedback and value your opinions and contributions. We can't do something about things we don't know about. Sometimes we can't do anything about what you are concerned about, but we can explain our thoughts and processes in these cases.

Take the time to enjoy the last term of 2023 and the many events and celebrations to come over the next few months.

Summary of Board Meeting 7 September

Mount Lawley Primary School Board Meeting was held 7 September 2023

Welcome, Introductions & Apologies: Apologies from Saul Karnovsky (SK), Catherine Pearce (CP) and Nathan Curnow (NC). Sandra Martin on leave.

Acknowledgement of Country: JL completed.

Disclosure of Interests: Nil.

Decision – Minutes of Meeting 10 August 2023: The minutes of the meeting on 10 August 2023 were accepted by AG and seconded by AH and approved.

Understand – Chair Report

• SZ will provide a summary of leadership update that is briefer than minutes to facilitate Board communication with community.

Understand - Finance Report

- LM reported tracking well with locally raised funds and cost centre managers and classrooms finalising spending.
- Just under 95% of goal of 85% collection of voluntary contributions.
- Board will note budget at next meeting and approve personal items, as well as approve voluntarily.

Understand - Principals Report

- JL update regarding Term 4 staffing.
- Discussion around Individual Disability Allocation (IDA) funding, including categories funded and clarification that funding was allocated to school for use as needed, rather than specifically for EA time.
- Projected enrolment for 2024 is 514 students. School is carefully considering classroom structures for 2024 to leave room for late enrolments, whilst creating class sizes that are financial sustainable.

Understand - Parent Survey

- JL discussed questions changes affected data tracking over years, hence changes kept to a minimum.
- Discussed previous change of title from Board survey to Parent Survey as questions are operational. Board does not influence operational aspects of school.
- Discussion regarding use of comments
 - Can this data be measured and used?
 - Hope that families would be comfortable to have a face-to-face discussion with staff even if it feels uncomfortable.
 - Concerns about unnecessarily personalised comments that are negative and cannot be followed up effectively as survey is anonymous.
- JL discussed working on the school culture so that any concerns that can be addressed are addressed over the school year.
- Start, stop, continue require comments and elicit helpful information about needs/concerns/strengths.
- Suggestion was to consider removing comments from other sections as this tends to lead to pages of comments that cannot be actioned. This runs the risk of parents feeling they were not listened to.
- Consider asking school community to send in any additional comments via email so these can be addressed effectively.
- Additionally, remind families of the different avenues for feedback/concerns etc.

Make – Board 2024

- Discussed tenures. TK's tenure ends December 2023 and she will not be renominating. TK requested "lead" board member to manage Board visibility strategy including updating website with new member information. CA and AH will take on this role.
- TK also discussed vacancy for Secretary role, no EOI from Board members attending.
