## Focus for 2017 – 2019

I lost my big sister in 2007. Her favourite saying was, "Life is not measured by the number of breaths we take, but by the moments that take our breath away" (Maya Angelou). I was reminded of that saying last Friday when we celebrated Harmony Day with a wonderful assembly and picnic. The students presented a range of their own work and, focusing on the theme of "Kindness", demonstrated our school values in the words they shared, the songs they sang and the joy of sharing lunch with their families and friends. This kind of camaraderie really highlights the kind of community we are and makes me proud to lead this wonderful school. I would particularly like to acknowledge the amazing work of our classroom teachers, our Music Specialist Judith Walpole and Deputy Principal Grace Adam, who does such fantastic work with our student leaders. To all the families who were able to stay on for the picnic to share food and good company – thank you. This day epitomizes our school vision of "Together".

It was a pleasure to host a Gifted and Talented workshop for parents and the wider community in celebration of Gifted Awareness Week. We were one of a number of schools and venues that offered a range of presentations to promote the importance of Gifted and Talented Education. Part of the workshop was to debunk some of the myths and misconceptions that surround these students and it was great to be able to speak with parents who often face a considerable struggle when advocating for their child. We have had such success with our two workshop presentations this term that we are looking forward to presenting a range of these evenings throughout the year, including presentations on Mathematics, Writing, Habits of Mind, Differentiation and Learning Intentions. Everyone is welcome!

Communication continues to be a focus for us as a whole school. We welcome your input into the level of communication you are receiving and to fill in 'any gaps' that may appear. As you know, the P&C are promoting a Class Representatives (class reps) initiative where the reps liaise between the teachers and parents with certain information. Some class reps have created closed Facebook groups for their classes, with parents invited to join. Please note that this is optional. The main source of communication regarding the school as a whole will come through the newsletter, website or App. When the teacher needs to contact you directly, they will do so by email, phone or write a note in the student diary. Facebook groups are just another 'arm' of communication and we are encouraged to hear that parents are (mostly) receiving a good level of communication from the school and the teachers. Classroom teachers are required to send a class newsletter at the start of each term, which will let parents know what is coming up over the term. Currently we have a sub-committee made up of our school Board members who are reviewing our communication policy. The new policy will be uploaded to the website when it is complete.

## Learning Assisted Program (LAP) 2018

**We are urgently seeking LAP Tutors to ensure the Learning Assisted Program can run successfully.**

LAP has been running *in Australia for over 35 years*. It started as a program to support students who were struggling with reading by **recruiting parents and other community members to become involved in supporting** these students, so that they have a more **positive learning experience**.

LAP was created to **identify those students that required a little extra support**. Volunteers (parents/student community members) are **the essential element in making this program function** and be successful. If the volunteers/tutors give a child two **30 minutes sessions (or one 60 minute session) of one on one attention**, it can make a huge difference in the child's confidence and attitude to learning. The rapport that develops between the tutor and the student is primary to the program's effectiveness

in **bringing about change**. The **individual time spent** with a LAP child, making them feel important and having **positive learning experiences** enables the child to take these attitudes/knowledge/skills back to the classroom.

The program can be as simple as reading a book to a child, having a chat about their weekend, playing educational board games, doing a jigsaw puzzle, completing educational computer games, assisting with sight words and sounds, working on basic maths operations with concrete materials or gaining confidence in writing. Teachers provide guidelines as to what is expected.

*What is important is the attention that the child receives!*

LAP has been running for **23 years** at Mt Lawley. To successfully run LAP at MLPS we need volunteers for two half hours a week to mentor students. Training and support is available. Volunteers can be parents, grandparents, older siblings or any other person interested in educating.

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) assesses literacy and numeracy skills that are essential for every child to progress through school and life. Students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 participate in the annual NAPLAN tests in reading, writing, language conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The tests provide parents and schools with an understanding of how individual students are performing at the time of the tests. NAPLAN tests are just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process; they do not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance. NAPLAN tests also provide schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working and whether young Australians are meeting important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum. All government and non-government education authorities have contributed to the development of NAPLAN materials.

Help your child prepare for NAPLAN by reassuring them that the tests are just one part of their school program, and by reminding them on the day to simply try their best. Teachers at Mount Lawley are working with the students to familiarise them with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance.

### What is Triple P?

The Triple P – Positive Parenting Program® is one of the world's most effective parenting programs. It gives parents the skills they need to raise confident, healthy children and teenagers and to build stronger family relationships. It also helps parents manage misbehaviour and prevent problems occurring in the first place. With more than 30 years of ongoing research, Triple P has been scientifically trialled with thousands of families around the world and been found to work for most families within a wide variety of cultures, countries and individual situations. Triple P has helped more than four million children and their families in 25 countries around the world. Professor Matt Sanders is founder of the Triple P – Positive Parenting Program. As a parent, you want to do the best for your child, but how do you know what's right? What do you do when your child answers back? Or is being bullied at school? Or starts telling obvious lies?

Over coming weeks in the Mount Lawley School Newsletter, I will share some of Triple P's proven tips for the best ways to handle common behavioural and developmental problems in children. From battling disobedience to encouraging homework routines, I'll cover those everyday issues to help you work out some strategies to suit your family. I'll highlight common "parent traps" and hopefully make the very important job of raising kids as enjoyable and rewarding as possible. But remember, parenting is sometimes hard work and it may take time to tackle more difficult problems. The good news is that help is always at hand. Mount Lawley Primary School are offering parenting support with Triple P, one of the world's most highly-regarding parenting programs.
