Welcome back to a brand new term, filled with lots of adventure! I hope you all had a wonderful holiday and took time to be your family in a relaxing and restorative way. Welcome to our new families who have started with us - we hope you settle in well to our primary school family.

Staff started back on Monday at our Hub Network Conference, that involves the surrounding primary and high schools, in an action-packed day of professional learning. It needs to be said the learning was probably diminished somewhat in the light of the absolutely spectacular morning tea provided to the Conference by our incredible P&C. There is no exaggeration when I say that the talk of the day wasn't the presenters (although they were great) - it really was all about the food! A huge thank you to Skye Langston who styled the morning tea, from the floristry to the colour coordinated tableware. Skye's family also had significant input into the event; making a sign that proudly displayed the Mount Lawley P&C name, as well as her gorgeous mum who made hot soup for everyone. On Tuesday, staff met back at school to look at a range of research on quality teaching and learning and the importance of critical feedback to students and the impact they have in the classroom. We are incredibly lucky to have a staff so willing to engage in robust discussions around learning and be self-reflective as we strive to go from good to great. We also engaged in professional learning with Emma Bibra, who will be working shoulder-to-shoulder with staff teaching the Educode program to students. After seeing how this program will unfold, we are so excited to get started! Educode supports our Digital Technologies curriculum which will be reported on at the end of Semester 2. Students will have the opportunity to engage in critical and creative thinking and problem solving, learn to code using both plugged and unplugged strategies as well as extending their thinking to develop the strategies and skills to prepare them for the digital age in which we already live, and will take into the future. The staff are inspired by this program which will most certainly engage all of our students!

This term we start preparing for the Athletics carnival, with Mr Howard back in the thick of Physical Education after doing an amazing job as Acting Deputy whilst Mrs Adam was on long service leave. Mr Howard spent time at our professional learning day upskilling staff in the preparation for the carnival and training that will start from now until Week 8, when the carnival is held on Friday 7 September. We also have the cross country and interschool cross country, so our students are going to be very fit by the end of Term 3!

## Story time and Play for Kindys

To build the connection between our Kindy families and the "big school", we will be offering Story Time and Play over the course of three Wednesdays - in Week 5 (15 August), Week 6 (22 August) and Week 7 (29 August) of this term. ## School Traffic

School is back and that means cars, cars and more cars! As you know Mount Lawley often has issues with traffic flow and parking. Can we please encourage you to make use of Hamer Park as a place to park and walk to collect your child - especially as - we now have the crossing guard, making it safer for all. If you do pick up your child by car, please obey the parking rules and be mindful of our neighbours. Please use the top end of the Kiss and Drive, which is supervised daily by a member of staff, to safely collect your child. Please **don't** encourage your child to exit at the Junior Primary gate and go onto the road to get into your car. Apart from being incredibly dangerous, it holds up the traffic and impacts on the entire Kiss and Drive. If everyone is patient and follows the traffic rules, we ensure the safety of all our students which is paramount.
