Lunch Boxes and Sustainability

The holidays are the perfect time to talk with your child about their lunchboxes! Since introducing our recycling and composting bins to students we have been incredibly surprised at the huge amount of food going to waste each day. In fact, our 3 compost bins are already overflowing! Perhaps over the holidays you might like to sit down with your child and discuss the following:

- What foods do they like in their lunch box?
- How MUCH food would they like in their lunch box?
- What kind of packaging is going into their lunch box and how could it be reduced?

Some suggestions might be only packing a small piece of fruit or fruit that is cut up and shared around the family. Some children only want to eat half an apple as opposed to a whole one, so cutting the fruit beforehand means they won't throw the whole piece in the bin!

Some children really want to make the most of their play time. Perhaps pack a smaller amount of food for recess and lunch and then bring them a snack they can eat on the way home when they are less distracted by the excitement of play time.

In Term 3, we will be encouraging the students to bring home what they haven't eaten. This may assist in giving you an idea of how much food you might like to pack each day if a large portion is being returned uneaten.

The staff on our Sustainability committee are passionate about reducing the waste in our school. Along with the Year 6 Sustainability Captains and the staff and students, we will continue to develop these programs to support our environmental studies.

Please let us know if you have any great ideas around lunch boxes and what has worked well in your family that we can share with others in our school community!

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD)

All schools in Australia, including Independent and Catholic schools, will participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data (NCCD) on School Students with Disability every year.

The Data Collection is an annual count of the number of students with disability receiving educational adjustments to support their participation in education on the same basis as students without disability.

All education agencies are now required under the Australian Education, Regulation 2013, to provide information on a *student's level of education, disability and level of adjustment* to the Australian Government Department of Education. Data will continue to be de-identified prior to its transfer and *no student's identity will be provided* to the Australian Government Department of Education.

The collection of this information from states and territories will inform future policy and program planning in relation to students with disability.
