Reviewing our Behaviour Expectations at Mount Lawley Primary School

Wellbeing is an important aspect in developing the whole child at MLPS and a key component of our teaching and learning frameworks. Learning emotional and behavioural regulation skills is like learning any other skill – children need to be explicitly taught how to do this.

Consequently, our focus this semester will be on supporting students to learn the skills that they need to successfully navigate through challenges they may face. Making sure that behavioural expectations at school are clearly outlined also helps all members of the school community to feel confident in knowing the type of culture we are aiming to foster here at MLPS.

As a community we understand the importance of fostering a positive school culture aligned to our beliefs. AT MLPS, we believe that students are at the centre of everything we do. We have high expectations for our students, supported by strong and respectful relationships and partnerships. We work collaboratively to create learning.

As we move through this semester, we will be sharing a Fortnightly Focus with the community and our staff will be explicitly teaching these expectations during the fortnight to provide clear and consistent language that we will use across the school as a whole.

This fortnight our focus expectation is:

We are ready to learn and actively participate.

We can demonstrate this in a variety of ways including:

- 1. Try our best and work hard.
- 2. Take accountability for our own learning.
- 3. Be organised with our equipment.
- 4. Being in the right place at the right time.

We look forward to keeping you informed as we continue to outline our expectations through the newsletter and our clear and consistent language.

After School Play

As we start the new term, it is always a good change to remind families of our after school play expectations:

- We ask that parents leave the school grounds no later than 3.45pm each afternoon.
- Students must be supervised by an adult at all times.
- Students to play on the playgrounds adjacent to Third Avenue. No play in the nature playgrounds or playground outside of Room 11 and 12.
- Students are not allowed to access any school equipment after school.

Thank you for supporting us in these areas so all students and families have a safe environment to play in after school.

Allergy Aware

Every year there is a growing number of children with severe food allergies. The most common food allergies are to peanuts, tree nuts, cow's milk, eggs, soy and seafood.

The symptoms of food allergy range from mild to life-threatening, with anaphylaxis the most severe form of allergic reaction. To minimise risk, we are an 'allergy aware' school.

While every effort is made to reduce the risks associated with allergies, it is not possible to achieve a completely allergen-free environment in an environment that is open to the general community. We do ask all families to support the safety of each student within the school, in considering the food choices that are packed in student lunchboxes. Where possible, please refrain from packing foods that contain nuts, including spreads such as Nutella. We also encourage students to wash their hands both before and after eating to help reduce possible allergens in the school yard.

Public School Review at MLPS 2024

All Western Australian public schools are reviewed every three years by the Department of Education's Public School Accountability directorate. A review gives assurance to the local community, the Minister for Education and Training and the Director General that a school is operating effectively and delivering high quality education to its students. The review acknowledges the achievements of the school and gives feedback to support the principal and staff with their improvement planning.

The principal provides the review team with a self-assessment of the school's performance based on evidence gathered by the Principal and staff. Information validated by the review team is considered before and during the school visit, which will be held on **Tuesday 6 August 2024**. This forms the basis for the school review report.

This report focuses on information gained from the self-assessment submission and the validation visit/process. It is focused on a review of the following 6 domains of school performance:

- Relationships and Partnerships
- Learning Environment
- Leadership
- Use of Resources
- Teaching Quality
- Student Achievement and Progress

A report is then provided to the principal, the Chair of the School Board and the Regional Executive Director and will be available on our school website later this year.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD)

Every year, all schools in Australia participate in the Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD). The NCCD process requires schools to identify information already available in the school about supports provided to students with disability. These relate to legislative requirements under the Disability Discrimination Act 1992 and the Disability Standards for Education 2005, in line with the NCCD guidelines (2019).

Our staff are currently completing this collection of data which assists us to:

- formally recognise the supports and adjustments provided to students with disability in schools
- consider how we can strengthen the support of students with disability in schools
- develop shared practices so that we can review our learning programs in order to improve educational outcomes for students with disability.

The NCCD provides state and federal governments with the information they need to plan more broadly for the support of students with disability.


