The Australian Government School Student Broadband Initiative (SSBI)

The Federal Government is offering free home internet for eligible families with school-aged students until 31 December 2025. To be eligible, families must:

- live in premises where they can access a standard NBN service
- have a child living at home who is enrolled in an Australian school.

The free broadband starts from the day the service is activated with a participating internet provider. Families will not be placed on a paid service by the internet provider at the end of the free service without consent.

On 15 May the Year 4 students in Room 16 conducted a waste audit with Aoife from Waste Sorted WA. Students collected rubbish from all the red and yellow bins in the school on one day to find out what we do well, and what we need to work on in the future.


During the exercise we found that our school is great at sorting containers for change, paper recycling and composting organic waste.

Students found the areas for improvement were:

- snack wrappers 120 pieces or 24,000 per year
- plastic bags/cling wrap 17 pieces or 3,167 per year
- whole fruit and uneaten food 1.08kg or 216.4 kg /year

Suggestions to reduce rubbish gong to landfill:

- It would be helpful to put more nude food in lunchboxes.
- Buy snacks in bulk packs rather than snack size packages and transfer into a reusable container or nude food lunchbox. It's cheaper too!
- Cut up food that is hard to eat so it doesn't get put into the bins e.g. cut apples and other hard fruit into bit size pieces.
- Parents could also pack food in the lunchboxes that will be most likely be eaten. Have a chat with your kids about food options/likes and dislikes.

Our school is looking toward a greener future. It would be awesome if we could aim to bring as much nude food to school as possible, more food from home was eaten at school and any uneaten food is taken home to discuss the reasons.
